These include state legislature @WeDrawTheLines, Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced and Tulare County Board of Supervisors as well as other cities, school districts and health districts.





2. Legal Compliance	Hispanic Citizen Voting Age Population(H-CVAP) data is an essential measure of Federal Voting Rights Act compliance in Kaweah Delta Health Zones. The Proposed map reflects H-CVAP majorities in two zones ranging from 54.9% to 62.4%.  · Zone 1 - 62.4%  · Zone 3 - 54.9%
3. Contiguity	All five districts are geographically contiguous.
4. Community Integrity	<ul> <li>☐ West Goshen and Goshen are kept together.</li> <li>☐ Green Acres is kept whole.</li> <li>☐ The Oval is kept whole.</li> <li>☐ St. John Parkway is kept whole.</li> <li>☐ Shannon Ranch is kept whole.</li> <li>☐ Black Oaks is kept Whole.</li> <li>☐ All communities of interest remain in their respective zones and their communities have not been split apart.</li> </ul>
5. City or CDP Integrity	Two identified significant landmarks, which are Mooney Blvd and Highway 198
6. Identifiable Boundaries	Current Zones are represented using identifiable boundaries, such as West Gosh and Goshen, Mooney Blvd, Dinuba Blvd, Ivanhoe, North part of Farmerville and the Oval neighborhood.
7.Compactness	Zone 3 is the least geographically compact, spanning a large area of the Northern part of the region.
8. No Political Parties	Current Zones boundaries do not appear to favor or discriminate against any political party.

## Summary

- ❖ 2020 Census confirm Latino population is over 50 percent of total Kaweah Delta Health Zones population.
- 2 majority Latino population Kaweah Delta Health zones can be created.
- \* Extensive discussion/collaboration with residents, community leaders from all parts of Tulare County led up to creation of several proposed maps that can achieve this goal.
- **EMC** map is complaint with Voting Rights Act (VAR) and Fair Map Acts.
