Community Integrity:

Goshen – small town West of Visalia near Highway 99.

Green Acres is a neighborhood in Northwest Visalia that is bordered by Downtown Visalia on the east, the Sequoia Freeway on the south, Demaree on the west, and Goshen Avenue on the north. Main Street is the area's principal thoroughfare which divides Green Acres into north and south sections. However, Green Acres can be recognized by the large amount of Valley Oak trees that crowd the banks of Mill Creek. The Visalia Country Club anchors the neighborhood. Homes in the eastern section, often referred to as "Old Green Acres," near North Fairway Street, are typically pre-War II while post-war and mid-century homes approach and cross westerly at North Ranch Street.

The Oval - According to the Oval Park Historical Society (OPHS.) There are no official boundaries for Visalia's Oval Park neighborhood. It is documented that the western part of Oval Park was separated from its eastern section by the construction of highway 63. Also, Murray Avenue cut off a large southern section of the neighborhood on its most southern part. History proves, however, that there are some general boundaries: Western Boundary: Willis Street, Northern Boundary: Houston Avenue, Eastern Boundary: Santa Fe Street, Southern Boundary: Murray Avenue, Oval Park itself consists, in whole or in part, of the neighborhoods of Oval Park (the area immediately surrounding the park), Visalia Heights, the East Village and the West Village.

The Lakes – at the corner of Akers and Goshen, entrance to The Lakes is on W. Elowin Avenue off of N. Akers Street N. Tamarack Street, to N. Roeben Drive, W. Prospect Avenue are the streets at the perimeter of The Lakes.

St. Johns parkway – St. John's parkway runs along the St. Johns River.

Shannon Ranch – generally located at W. Riggin Avenue, N. Demaree Street, Pratt Road, Riverway Drive and N. Divisadero Street.

These include state legislature @WeDrawTheLines, Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced and Tulare County Board of Supervisors as well as other cities, school districts and health districts.






