



Treatment Options

- » Non-Surgical
 - Diet
 - Healthy weight
 - Exercise
 - Medications
 - Injection
 - Physical therapy
- » Surgical
 - Arthroscopy
 - Joint replacement



Treating Arthritis: Cortisone Injections

 Cortisone is the generic name for antiinflammatory steroid

 Can be given in the office for any joint pain

Works >90% of the time,
 but may only be temporary

















When other treatments no longer bring relief, it may be time to consider joint replacement surgery.






What Qualifies You for a Joint Replacement?

You may qualify for joint replacement if you have:

- Arthritis on xrays
- Failed Non-operative treatments
- Disabling pain
- Acceptable surgical risk.


Normal Hip

- X-Ray
- Round socket
- Cartilage "space"
- Round ball




Arthritic Hip

- No cartilage space
- Irregular ball
- Bone spurs occur on edge of joint



What is Hip Replacement Surgery

- Socket
 (shell) smooth it out
- 2. Liner(between socket and ball)
- 3. Ball
- 4. Stem: to anchor the ball





Knee Arthritis

- Osteoarthritis
- Rheumatoid Arthritis
- Post-traumatic

In 2010, over 600,000 knee replacement surgeries done in the USA

By 2030, expected over 3.5 million knee replacements annually


Nearly 1/2 of all Americans will develop knee osteoarthritis in at least one knee in their lifetime

Persistent Pain or Stiffness that limits everyday activities

Non-operative measures not sufficient


Bone on bone contact or angular deformity
